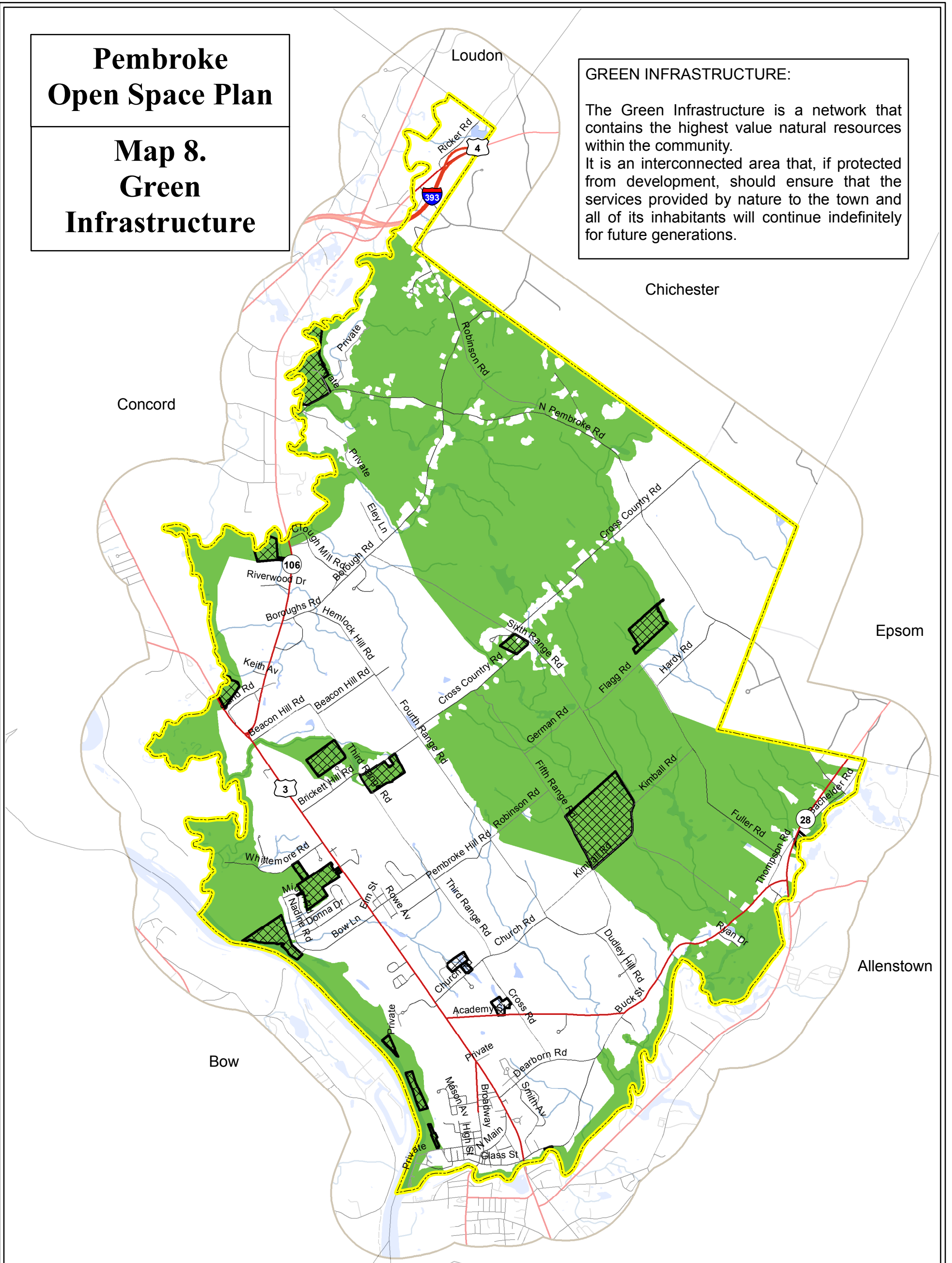

GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE:

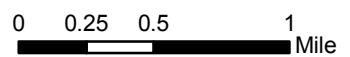

It is an interconnected area that, if protected from development, should ensure that the services provided by nature to the town and all of its inhabitants will continue indefinitely for future generations.
